FIRST FORGIVENESS AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS. Last March we announced on our school website that provisionally we hoped to celebrate First Forgiveness on 22/06/21 for Year 4 children and their First Holy communion on 10/07/21. In mid-May we put the Forgiveness back to 6th July. However, at a recent meeting between Miss Angeline, Monica Ferguson and Fr Jim we reflected on the situation regarding Covid 19 in the North West and decided it was not wise to go ahead with these celebrations before the school holidays. We will reconsider the situation at the beginning the new academic year.
