You will find great peace and spiritual joy in spending a prolonged time of silence with the Lord and it will give you an opportunity to intercede in the most powerful way possible on a weekly basis for all of your loved ones. Below is an explanation of the graces which come from having perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in a parish, adapted from a text written by the Franciscan Friars of Marytown, USA:

## What are some good reasons for establishing Perpetual Adoration?

To provide an easy, attractive, and practical way of rendering God the adoration which is His due as our Creator, of giving Him thanks for our redemption, of making reparation for our sins and the sins of mankind, of petitioning the Lord for the constant help we need. To show our gratitude to Him for remaining among us in our tabernacles, and to make at least some atonement for the many sacrileges, acts of indifference and ingratitude which He receives in His Sacrament of Love.

## What spiritual benefits and graces can be attributed to the establishment of a parish Perpetual Adoration program?

\* an increase in Mass attendance and reception of the sacraments; \* return of fallen-away Catholics and increase in the number of conversions; \* increase in priestly vocations; \* renewal of Catholic family life; \* the spiritual level of the people is raised with a resulting desire and courage to spread the "good news" to others; \* a greater community spirit, centered as it is on the heart of the parish: Jesus' presence in the Blessed Sacrament.

**Gift Aid**: please remember that if you are a tax payer and you 'gift aid' your donation, HMRC will give us 25% for every pound donated. It is also possible to 'gift aid' donations made through the online donation page.

**First Class Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis:** I just wanted to let you know that we have received a first class relic of Blessed Carlo from the Archbishop of Assisi. The only other churches in the UK that I know of which have such a relic are the church of his baptism in Kensington and the church of Corpus Christi which is the shrine of the Blessed Sacrament for the Westminster Archdiocese. It is a great privilege for us here at St Joseph's. It happens to be his feast day on Wednesday October 12th. His relic will be venerated at the end of Mass.

**2 Kings 5:14-17**: Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

**Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations.

**2 Timothy 2:8-13:** Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

Alleluia, alleluia! Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

**Luke 17:11-19** On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
