Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Thanks to the generosity of so many people, this coming Monday, we are just about able to begin our perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, from 7am to 7pm, Monday to Friday. We are still in need of more adorers if you are not yet signed up, but we have enough committed people to get us started. (Some are covering more than one hour so as to permit us to begin the chain of uninterrupted intercession and love for Christ.) During the colder months, most of the hours of adoration will take place in the adoration chapel near the sacristy. The sacristy door will be left unlocked during the time of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. The hour from 11am to 12pm, just before daily Mass, will take place on the main altar of the church, as the entire church will be well heated at that time. It is not possible for us at the moment to heat the entire church for twelve hours every day.

Please find included in this newsletter our new schedule for Masses, adoration, and confessions. I have extended the times for the Sacrament of Confession and added an evening opportunity to be reconciled with the Lord, so as to give all a chance to receive the healing and transforming grace of the Divine Mercy. The holy Rosary - with a special petition for vocations - will be recited at 6:30pm every evening, followed by the Litany of St Joseph and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Outside of these times it is important to maintain an atmosphere of silence during adoration, so as to allow each one to pray and meditate in whatever way they desire. We want to create an oasis of peace and tranquillity in the midst of our noisy and busy world. Let us entrust this new initiative to the care of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, the first and most perfect adorer of Jesus, and to the powerful intercession of St Joseph our protector. May God bless you all.
